## Elective Description:

The elective in Allergy and Clinical Immunology in the Department of Medicine at Yale University School of Medicine is a fully combined adult and pediatric program with faculty, patients, and conferences in both specialties. There is an emphasis on conferences, journal clubs, seminars, and research sessions with immunobiology faculty at Yale. We have great clinical breadth, covering typical allergic rhinitis, allergic asthma, systemic anaphylaxis, urticaria, angioedema, drug allergies as well as autoimmunity, connective tissue diseases, and diverse antibody and T cell involved diseases and B and T cell immunodeficiencies. We have rich interactions with our immunodermatology, immunohepatology, pulmonary, infectious disease, gastroenterology, and immunohematology colleagues as well as ENT surgery, and rheumatology. Rotations are available for two or four week periods.

### Answer
