

Elective Description:

The primary educational objective of the Yale Infectious Disease elective rotation is to provide Internal Medicine residents with a scholarly environment for learning the evaluation and management of a broad range of community acquired and nosocomial infectious disease problems. Residents participate as active members of the consultative and training program in Infectious Diseases at Yale-New Haven Hospital. This includes daily work rounds, daily attending rounds, microbiology rounds four times a week two weekly clinical conferences and didactic conferences. In addition, residents may have the opportunity to evaluate patients in the outpatient HIV clinics. Residents and Interns are scheduled for either 2 consecutive weeks or 4 consecutive weeks rotations.
